Lead Pastor Report

Pastor Nate Kemper

2021 might be defined most easily for ministry and church life as a time of transition. We saw that happen on our staff as Pastor Rob transitioned to Lead Pastor of Compassion Church, Cherie Morgan transitioned into a clearer role to serve her family and Cindy Jacob transitioned to be near family in Iowa. That meant significant transition in our staff.

The Covid pandemic in 2020 extended its changes into 2021 as well. We were able to transition ministries back into many of the schedules and locations we were accustomed to but saw many using this as an opportunity to evaluate how they would engage with us. New connections have been forming and other faces have been missed.

Our building has gone through quite a bit of transition. There was construction happening for all of 2021 as we saw many of our rooms repaired, updated, or improved. Transition just seemed present everywhere.

While it is easy to see some of the transition, we are also thankful for a God who makes it easy to see that He is clearly still moving in and through us. We saw people express their generosity in 2021 in unprecedented ways. General Offerings were the highest they have ever been and don't account for the other projects generosity covered. We were able to launch Compassion Church as a church plant with both substantial giving from our church collectively as well as many others giving above and beyond to see that work happen. We were able to upgrade technology, HVAC units and roofing with money that came above and beyond for special projects. In a season where the economy has felt hard for many families, we've seen people respond with great generosity here. What a testimony to our good God.

We also continue to see people give their life to Christ and go public with that in baptism. We had adults respond to the call of faith for the first time, kids dedicate themselves to God and saw youth grow in their intimacy with Christ. We also had 7 people that shared their relationship with Christ to us through baptism. What a joy to see God working in individual lives.

Together we spent the year looking at the different rhythms God calls us to. It was the longest I've ever spent in a topical series, looking at our rhythms with God, with family, with each other and with the world around us. It was foundational to what God asks of us and many found fruit in that. Others are excited now to be back to expositional preaching as well. I get that. I'm thankful God's Word is living and active as we look at it for guidance together. We love seeing most of you attending in person again, it feels more like community and family that way, but we are also aware that there is benefit and need for digital ministry to continue. Even after the livestream our services are viewed about 65 times a week after they are uploaded.

During our rhythms series we had several families engage with a marriage enrichment survey to learn more about their relationships. That helped those individual couples but also gave us some insight to our church's relationships. That allowed us to focus some of our discipleship efforts towards helping our felt needs and a communication and conflict resolution was held considering that identified need.

Personally, I remain thankful for the opportunity to serve in this role. The support from the church, its leadership, and my family are of great encouragement to me. I'm blessed to work alongside a wonderful staff who all prioritize what God is up to and enable us to equip people to find life and faith in Christ. I'm thankful to have finished the ordination work in our denomination and to have celebrated that with you last summer. I'm looking forward to what God has for us as we move out of a transition period and into advancing ministry in our lives, our community, and the world we have opportunity to impact.

Associate Pastor Report

Introduction: This is my ninth year on staff at Nowthen. My primary tasks have included: facility management, administration & communications, missions, and general pastoral care. While most of my responsibilities have been “behind the scenes,” I continue to experience a taste of teaching, visitation, counseling, and preaching. It continues to be a blessing to serve at NAC.

Administration & Communications: In 2021 we regained a substantial portion of our congregation to in person worship. At the same time we continue to see that nearly one third of our service attendance is remote. We estimate that roughly 75 individuals participate in our services via our electronic stream and another 30 view service recordings. While the net effect is that one third worship remotely and two thirds in person, we do not know if this pattern will persist. We pray that the Holy Spirit would guide our Elders in these matters – understanding that while methods may change the message is constant!

Facilities: By God’s grace we were able to address a number of major repairs in 2021 including the roof and our HVAC system. God provided a vendor to us that understood the realities of church operation, damage mitigation, and insurance coverage. In conjunction with our insurance company, the Oasis group mitigated interior water damage and replaced our entire roof. They were also able to put together a plan that allowed us to replace ten of our older roof top HVAC units. Finally, the Oasis group will return the interior spaces of buildings B and C to “like new” condition. When completed, Nowthen will have near a quarter million dollars in improvements covered by insurance.

Missions: In June of 2021 we sent a team from Nowthen to Manta, Ecuador. (Because of Covid we needed to cancel our trips in 2020.) While the missions team continues our three-tier approach to missions, we are making transitions in our global tier. Since we have NAC international workers in Taiwan, Ecuador, and Germany, we plan to promote partnerships with Kalen and Britta Thrane (Africa), Caleb and Erin Kohl (Germany), and Chris and Jamie O’Dell (Taiwan). We implement our local tier via monthly Missions Partners including: Eliever, Young Life, CAER, Samaritan’s Purse, Compassion International, The Alliance Women, CAMA, GCF, and local giving ministries.

Pastoral Care: The pandemic required us to make significant changes in pastoral care. In 2020 we combined a number of ministries into the CARE team and we continue to rely on this team. Members of the CARE team contact for visitation, offer assistance and provide general care for our congregation. These allows NAC Pastors to concentrate on those in care centers or hospitals. Shepherding has taken on a new focus in 2021. On a side note, I have prepared two more video Sunday School classes in 2021 for those unable to attend in person. Currently, the Gospel of Mark is available on the church website.

In conclusion, I want to thank Laura, my bride of 41 years, for her faithful support and constant love. Laura and I thank each of you for your encouragement to us this past year. Blessings to each of you!

Let God empower you, then live out your testimony sharing what God has done for you by calling you out of darkness and into His wonderful light. Though we are imperfect, we CAN glorify God and give testimony sharing who Jesus is and what He has done and is doing in us. I want to thank all the people involved in worship and tech ministries. I see so many of you serving faithfully, coming to rehearsals ready, attentive to detail and giving Jesus your best. Keep improving. Keep your motive solid in glorifying God with every note! What you are doing touches the heart of God and invites the people of NAC to a relationship with Jesus! We continue to improve in areas of technology in sound and video presence. We are not there yet and need someone to manage our tech so that what happens in the building AND online can be excellent week after week. Christmas this season was amazing with many children leading worship singing praises to Jesus. They were great! Next Christmas I hope to do a benefit concert for the community that encourages NAC to invite people to benefit the community in some way using music, media and fun. I hope to use more children and youth in services in 2022 as well. 55 people were faithfully active in worship and tech in 2021.

Small Groups: We started a new small group this year with young families. We had 6 faithful groups running through the year with Growth Track starting back up in the fall. Thank you, small group leaders, for loving and caring for people as you lead them to Jesus!!! So grateful for you! It's not always easy. We have a handful of other small groups as well that are closed groups to keep their intimacy which is a good thing. Grateful for those leaders as well. Small Groups continue to be an important ministry designed to keep the balance between building relationships with one another AND encourage growth in our relationship with Jesus. I'm working on finding material for 2022 that unifies small groups so that we know Jesus and are passionate to lead others to Him. I hope to add two more small groups by the fall of 2022. Over 100 people were involved in small groups.

Growth Track: Growth Track restarted in the fall of 2021. Excited to see newer people grow in their relationship with Jesus and one another! Covid hurt us in 2020 to 2021, but we got it restarted in the fall of 2021 and will continue through 2022. This is a great resource to connect new people with one another, give them a friend to connect to, and know how to use what God has given them to be able to connect, grow and participate at Nowthen Alliance and in the world around them. The Growth Track is offered every other month starting in September and goes through May every season.

Connections: We restarted the connections team in the fall of 2021. This team connects people that come through our doors on Sunday morning to invite them to connect with us and encourage connection with Jesus through a next step or small groups. They love people at the door and in the building bringing a smile and relationship that we all need. I'm so grateful for these people who make coming to church an inviting and pleasurable one. We need you! In 2022 I hope to connect the new people of NAC better to the Growth Track, Small Groups, opportunities to serve, or just one another. More than 38 people were involved in this team in 2021.

Decorations: Meagen Sundstrom and Cindy Gregorsen have been faithfully creating beautiful spaces in our church. Their husbands, Doug and Eric have been an amazing help as well cleaning out storage and being great help for the ladies as they design and create spaces for worship upstairs and downstairs. Thank you and great job!

Grounds: Sandy Wallace has worked hours and hours weeding, planting new perennials, cleaning out the rose bushes in the front of door B, and creating spaces at the doors that are beautiful and inviting as we come into the church. It all looks amazing! So grateful for you! Some of you have helped her at times. So thankful for that! We need more people helping to weed this summer. Please even come once and spend a few hours helping out so she isn't alone! Let me know you can help and I'll connect you with her. (huntern@nowthenalliance.org)

Children's Ministries Report

Nowthen Family, it has been such a joy stepping into this community and getting the opportunity to help lead so many wonderful families and children to pursue Christ as individuals and all together. In my short time here, God has been faithful to us through provision and opportunities for ministry and my family. As we are preparing to welcome our favorite little surprise into the world, I reflect on how wonderful these past eight months have been being on staff and seeing God at work.

2021 celebration points

Although I have only been a part of this family since August, Cherie Morgan helped equip me for success by having things set in place as I stepped in. As families step back into a rhythm of life with less covid impact, we can see blessings on blessings. This past summer, Corner Ball Club was successful with 206 registered students and around 70 volunteers!

Sundays: Although we have not been able to bring back children's church, it has been a massive point of joy to see so many students worshiping and learning alongside their parents in the services. Sunday mornings allow us to see many students come through both the nursery and Sunday school classes each week. We have the blessing of wonderful and faithful volunteers who have taken on the task of engaging with kids and teaching them some of what the Bible has to teach us. The nursery has seen its highest level of students during the 10:45 service. While volunteer levels often leave the nursery as an "on-call" option during the 8:30 service, we are thankful to be able to provide care on a nearly weekly basis. Sunday Family Funday is something that we have started to encourage family time and provide faith development tools to parents to encourage their children's faith walk along with their own. Each month we have served a few more families who have chosen to come and participate, leaving us with somewhere between 40 and 60 people in attendance each month.

Wednesdays: During the summer, we did Family Fun Nights in place of VBS amid the transition of leadership within Children's Ministry. Family Nights were well attended each week with a different theme or activity. We saw involvement from Nowthen families and families from our surrounding community.

Awana has been taking place on Wednesday evenings starting in late September and running through the end of April. With around 70 registered students and 28 volunteers, we see approximately 65 people come through our doors and stay for the duration of Awana programming each week!

2022 Goals, Mission and Vision

We will host both Corner Ball Club and Summer Family Nights again this summer. While preparations are well underway, we are ready for a wonderful summer completed by incredible God moments through time as a community. Sundays this summer will result in one elementary class again. However, we will go back to two elementary classes again in the fall!

The nursery will continue to be available to parents where we can provide a safe and caring environment for parents to feel comfortable leaving their children. At the same time, they attend Sunday School or services. The fall will bring about some new changes to our Wednesday evening programming but will bring about the return of Sunday Family Funday starting on September 11th.

Audit Summary

The Audit Committee has reviewed the financial records for 2021 and have again found the financial records and process to be well organized and in good condition with no abnormalities.

We reviewed financial statements and the internal controls. This included the regular contributions, invoices, bank statements and corresponding documentation.

- Samples of deposits were matched to bank statements and to deposit summaries prepared by the offering counters. We found that monies were deposited in a timely manner and distributed correctly to the accounts designated by the givers.
- Invoices and payables were reviewed and found to be paid accurately and timely.
- Time sheets for part-time paid positions are reviewed and approved and payments made in a timely manner.

Weekly deposits are counted by two individuals each Sunday morning. The counters verify the deposit amount, reports are prepared and signed by each individual. Deposits are promptly delivered to the bank each week.

From the audit we performed, we feel confident that the financial records of Nowthen Alliance Church for 2021 are in satisfactory order.

We would like to commend those involved with the financial activities of the church for the exceptional organization and hard work. Their time and efforts are greatly appreciated.

Notes:

Our building loan with Bank of the West was refinanced in April. The interest rate on the prior loan was 4.87% while the rate on the new loan is 3.55%, a reduction of 1.32%. The monthly payment was reduced from \$4,461 to \$2,579. The new loan began with a balance of \$496,000 and has a term of ten years. It is estimated the balance of the new loan in April, 2031 will be about \$350,000 and a new loan will need to be negotiated at that time.

Capital improvements made during year 2019 include: replacing a parking lot light that fell, installing a new water fountain, and upgrading light fixtures for greater efficiency.

Capital Improvements made during year 2020 include: A computer to offer our services online and live-streamed; two large screens for the sanctuary.

Capital Improvements made during year 2021 include: Ten new rooftop HVAC units and an elevated audio/visual booth including new audio/visual equipment.

During 2011, a contribution was received from the Audrey Anderson estate in the amount of \$41,354 for supporting our Nowthen Missionaries. On January 1, 2012, these funds were used to reduce the loan balance. Each month the amount of interest that would have been paid on this portion of the loan is set aside to support our Nowthen Missionaries.

During 2006, a contribution was received from the family of Arvid and Fern Anderson in the amount of \$42,000 to support the Big Sandy Camp Scholarship Fund for our children and youth. Initially, \$2,000 was placed in the Big Sandy Camp Scholarship Fund and \$40,000 was invested. The investments were redeemed and on March 1, 2012, the loan balance was reduced an additional \$40,000. Each month the amount of interest that would have been paid on this portion of the loan is set aside in the Big Sandy Camp Scholarship Fund, and the money is used to reduce the cost of attending camp for those who complete a scholarship application.
