


This edition of the NAC eNews will focus on Memorial Day and the Volunteer Recognition Brunch on June 4. We will begin with a tribute to those who sacrificed so much for the freedom we enjoy in America.



<u>Memorial Day</u>. John recorded the words of Jesus in chapter 15 of his gospel. In verse 13 Jesus exclaims, "Greater love has no one than to lay down his life for another." Jesus was speaking of His love and His sacrifice to bring everlasting life to all who believe, yet the principle of this statement applies. Memorial Day exists to honor those who laid down their lives to keep our nation free. There are many ways that we can remember those who gave their all; perhaps you have a family or church tradition. Today, we will read a short tribute and recite a Memorial Day prayer. The following poem was written by a young gulf war veteran named Samuel Lombardo and is titled, "This is Memorial Day."

"This is Memorial Day in our land of the free. It's because of those who sacrificed, whose graves you're here to see. They fought on foreign lands, and across the open seas, and paid the ultimate price, to keep you and I free. So put all things aside and honor this important day, which we have dedicated as Memorial Day."

While simple and concise, it is free of political pomp, focusing on those deserving honor. Let us put all things aside and reflect on those who served and died. And as you do, read this simply Memorial Day Prayer: "Dear Heavenly Father,

With a sober heart we come before You this Memorial Day. We pause for a moment and call to mind all the men and women who have died in the service of our nation since 1776. Dear God, please look with mercy on our brave and selfless brothers and sisters, who did not shirk from their task but gave themselves completely to the cause of defending and protecting us all. Bless all who have given their lives for the sake of liberty, and grant them eternal rest with You. We remember also our brave men and women now serving in our Armed Forces, both at home and abroad. Dear God, send out Your angels to protect them. Help them discharge their duties honorably and well. Please bring them safely home to their families and loved ones. Please bring Your peace and mercy to our troubled world. We ask this, Father, in the name of Jesus. Amen."

The Vineland C&MA Church Partnership

<u>Vineland Partnership</u>: Nowthen has formed a partnership with the Vineland church on the

shores of Lake Mille Lacs. Although the Vineland church has ministered to the Ojibwe people for many years, they recently received approval to construct a new facility on their property - which happens to be within the Ojibwe reservation. At this time we seek volunteers to provide labor - teams are scheduled on weekdays and Saturdays. Tim Frame and Pastor Bruce serve as NAC coordinators for the Vineland Ministry. To this point we have sent teams to clear brush and demolish the old building. Near the end of May they will need labor to tend blocks, later to assist in the construction phase. While a contractor has been hired (and the contractor will provide the skilled labor), they still need many hands to assist. Feel free to commit to only one trip or only one type of work.
