

This edition of the NAC eNews will focus on Thanksgiving. In addition, we will preview many of the events and ministries occurring at Nowthen over the Christmas season. Let us begin with the Thanksgiving Eve service:

**Thanksgiving Eve Service**: This traditional service will be held Wednesday, November 22, in the sanctuary at 7:00pm. The Lord's Supper will be served during this special service. Each year we receive a special Thanksgiving offering. This year the proceeds will go towards the additional expenses required to prepare for the addition of the third service.

Why do we celebrate Thanksgiving? There are many historical accounts of "Thanksgiving" celebrations occurring as early 1620 in America. Each of these historical accounts places the Almighty God at the forefront. Granted, many of the celebrations included native Americans, but the purpose was always to honor God rather than honor any ethnic group. This fact is so well established that one can simply Google Thanksgiving. The Mayflower sailed in September and arrived in Cape Cod in late November of 1620. That first winter was extremely difficult and nearly half of the 102 Pilgrims died. Life was difficult in America and those that survived sought to give thanks to God for His provision. The day was not about a large meal, rather it was to honor God for the meager portions that they prayed would last the harsh winter.

Let us fast forward 160 years to 1780. By this time Thanksgiving was firmly established in American culture. As evidence of this fact, I would like to share a portion of the Thanksgiving proclamation made by President George Washington in 1784 (and revised in 1789) to demonstrate the mindset of the Founding Fathers.

"Whereas it is the duty of all nations to acknowledge the providence of Almighty God, to obey His will, to be grateful for His benefits, and humbly to implore His protection and favor-- and whereas both Houses of Congress have by their joint Committee requested me to recommend to the People of the United States a day of public thanksgiving and prayer to be observed by acknowledging with grateful hearts the many signal favors of Almighty God especially by affording them an opportunity peaceably to establish a form of government for their safety and happiness. Now therefore I do recommend and assign Thursday the 26th day of November next to be devoted by the People of these States to the service of that great and glorious Being, who is the beneficent Author of all the good that was, that is, or that will be. That we may then all unite in rendering unto Him our sincere and humble thanks, for His kind care and protection of the People of this Country."

Who wanted to give thanks to God at Thanksgiving? Well, according to George, the entire nation did, regardless of political party, church denomination, or cultural heritage. Today, Thanksgiving remains an official holiday, but the subject of our Thanksgiving has been removed. As you join with family and friends to celebrate Thanksgiving this year, may you remember God's provisions and the blessings that have been granted.



<u>Christmas Services 2017</u>: Christmas Eve falls on a Sunday this year. There will be services at 8:30am, 11:00am, and at 3:00pm. All three services will be similar with the same message. The 8:30am service will be in the sanctuary while the 11:00am and 3:00pm services will be held in the lower worship center. More details will follow in the near future.



**Give the Gift of Christmas to a Family**: It has been a tradition of the Elders to provide funds to families in our service area that have struggled during the past year. If you know of a friend or neighbor that has struggled in 2017 and is in need of a blessing this Christmas submit their name and mailing address to Pastor Bruce. Early in December the church will mail selected families a package including: a word of encouragement and a Visa Gift card. The family will be able to purchase gifts for their children that they might not have otherwise been able to do.
